- I. Grant Right of Way: Evergy is asking the city to give them a IO foot right of way to set poles to provide electricity to the new Family Dollar. Motion was made by Ellison; seconded by Wood to allow the mayor to sign the documents granting the right of way. 6-0 Motion Carried
- 2. Proposed Resolution: Loan resolution for funding on Phase II Sewer work through USDA in the amount of \$668,000.00. Motion was made by Wood; seconded by Davis to approve. 6-0 Motion Carried

3. Proposed Resolution: Loan resolution for funding on Phase II Sewer work through USDA in the amount of \$577,000.00. Motion was made by Patterson; seconded by Ellison to approve. 6-0 Motion Carried

- 4. AEMT School: Amanda Childers and Kathryn Williams would like permission to attend AEMT School. Estimated class cost is \$3,180.00 per student which includes tuition, books, and fees. The city can receive funding from the of Board of EMS in the amount of \$1,500.00 per student with a I-year service agreement which would potentially reduce the cost per student to \$1,680.00 each. Motion made by Patterson; seconded by Ellison to approve request to attend AEMT School but also get their CPR Instructor Certification. 6-0 Motion Carried
- 5. Pay Increase for City Employee: Requested pay request for Matt Childers. Is in the process of enrolling in the KRWA Apprenticeship program for wastewater operator. Motion made by Ellison; seconded by Wood to approve pay increase to \$18.00 per hour effective immediately. 6-0 Motion Carried
- 6. 100 Mile Yard Sale Event: Request was made to allow people and vendors to setup in Wark Park during the 100 Mile Sale, September 9th and 10th Motion made by Patterson; seconded by Ellison to approve request. 6-0 Motion Carried
- 7. Tire Disposal Fee: Part of City-Wide Cleanup was to allow citizens to take old tires to Main Street Auto for disposal. There was a total of848 tires to be disposed of. The disposal bill totaled \$3,384.06 of which Main Street paid \$716.00, Caney Betterment Group paid \$1,334.00 of which \$600.00 was donations by citizens. Request was made that the remaining balance of\$1,334.06 be paid by the City of Caney. Motion was made by Patterson; seconded by Wood to have the city pay the remaining balance. 6-0 Motion Carried
